Founded in 2015, the Center for College Student Success (CCSS) empowers first-generation and lower-income (FLI) students in the College by providing resources and tools to further student success, and programming and community events that reinforce positive self-identity and a sense of belonging. FLI: first-generation (neither of your parents/guardians completed a 4-year degree in the US) and/or low-income (from a low-income background, includes Pell Grant recipients or families with income less than \$125k/year) - students can self-identify as FLI!
