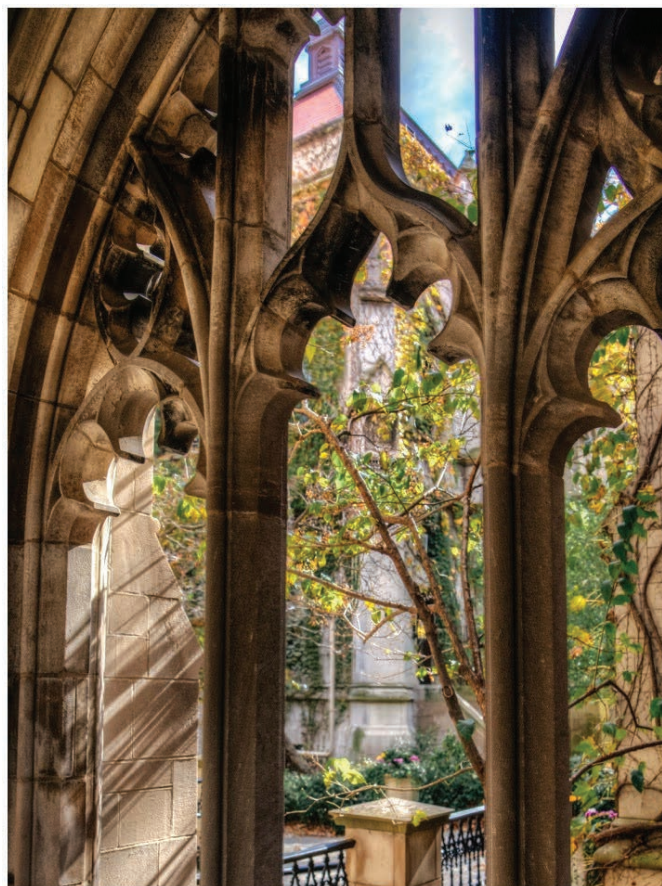
Dean of the College, Melina Hale, hosts brunch in honor of you, the University of Chicago's family members. Seating is available indoors on each level of the building.
