


What is the Orientation Team?

These students play an integral role in the welcoming and transition of the incoming student population and their families by serving as a role model, ambassador, and support system throughout Pre-Orientation, Orientation Week, and beyond.

 - Assist with Orientation Week event logistics and execution






Desired Skills & Qualifications

Application Elements

- Online application at oteam.uchicago.edu
- General bio information
- Two short answer questions (max 200 words)
- Upload current resume
- Recommendation letter
 - An automated form will be sent to your recommender

- A recommender could be:
 - A past or current supervisor
 - RSO Involvement Advisor
 - Academic Adviser
 - \circ RH/RD
 - Faculty or professional staff
 - High school teacher
- A recommender cannot be:
 - A peer
 - O An RA
 - Family member



Resume Resources

- A snapshot of your background, as it's relevant to the position!
- Provides an overview of your previous work and/or relevant experiences
- Gives insight into your skills, experiences, and qualifications as a candidate.

- This is your opportunity to stand out and show us what makes you a unique candidate


